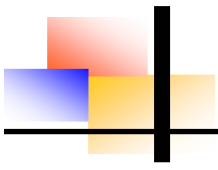
## **Baptism Class:**

## REFLECTIONS FROM Pastor Lisa

---

A few days ago when I went to the hospital, Lona shared an e-mail with me. We both thought it said an awful lot, and I thought you might like it too.

***Philippians 4:13 – I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.***

***The road to success is not straight. There is a curve called Failure, a loop called Confusion, speed bumps called Friends, red lights called Enemies, caution lights called Family. You will have flats called Jobs. But, if you have a spare called Determination, an engine called perseverance, insurance called Faith, a driver called Jesus, you will make it to a place called Success.***

How much doesn't God teach us through those failures and confusions, friends, enemies and family, and even those jobs. They are all part of life and living in this world. From our failures we learn what doesn't work, and wisdom is practiced in not repeating those failures over and over again. I forget how many hundreds, or even thousands of experiments that failed before Thomas Edison successfully invented the light bulb. He learned from didn't work and we all are the recipients of his creation. Our failures can help us be more creative and who knows how many will benefit!

Our times of confusion can push us headfirst into the Word of God. We want to know "why" and "when" and "how" for things in life. Sometimes we find those answers, and sometimes we don't. What we do find are stories of God's people who had the same confusions. We hear the rest of their stories and learn that God NEVER abandons His own. We have all been bought and paid for by the blood sacrifice of God's Son, the perfect Lamb of God. Even if we don't find the answers we think we need, we do learn that we can have faith in God.

Our friends and family bring us joy and comfort and love, hopefully anyway. Our enemies can make us question who we are and what we do. Maybe those are uncomfortable times of reflection, but necessary nonetheless. Perhaps that forced self reflection can help us be better people in the long run. Perhaps there is no redeeming value in the hardship other than we can learn again of God's faithfulness even in the hard times.

Our jobs can help us "roll" through life, but sometimes they need some repair, or even a change. Like tires need air and maintenance, so to do our job skills. If we don't seek to learn something each day, we can find our jobs flat and pretty useless. How discouraging to be in a job that doesn't bring us joy and satisfaction. But that spare of determination can take us far until we can find that next job that does use all our gifts and skills so that we can be filled with joy once more.

God gives us the gift of our driver Jesus, and the spiritual gifts of perseverance and faith along with many others. Success in God's kingdom may not come with wealth, power and prestige. But it does come with the hope of hearing God welcome us home one day with the words, "Well done good and faithful servant."

**Minutes of the Congregational Council  
December 17, 2007**

Members Present: Kolleen Felber, Dallas Sloan, Barb Swant, Ardis Ress, Clarice Fall, Jim Forsman, Jason Erb, Joe Johnson, Pastor Lisa Shank, Marvin Organ, Terry Jergenson, Mary Shearer, Pastor Bruce Beyer. Excused: Gail Smith, Lisette Ritchie, Judy Amundson.

The meeting opened with devotions given by Terry Jergenson. The secretary's report was accepted as amended.

The treasure's report was given, and as of November 30 we had a combined balance in checking/savings of -\$2,001.05. As of the meeting date, the congregation stands at 95% of pledged offerings. Joe felt optimistic that year-end giving would provide us with the necessary funds to close out the year's expenses.

Discussion was held regarding the congregation's commitment to the Vision Team's challenge. Among items up for discussion was the possibility of renting the Office on Aging's transport to help get homebound parishioners here for worship. The rental would be covered under our current insurance policy.

Discussion was held regarding the stewardship campaign. The council expressed its appreciation to the Stewardship Committee for all of their hard work and a job well done. Project expenses were discussed, as well as the logistics of delivering offering envelopes. At this time, members are expected to pick up their envelopes from the church building at their convenience. However, this approach is not working well, and the expense of mailing the envelopes is quite high. Joe proposed a suggestion that an initial offering might cover the expense of mailing envelopes.

Joe/Clarice moved that \$1,148.00 be transferred from the Hawkinson Fund to the General Fund for BeFriends Training. The motion carried.

The council voted unanimously to approve the following membership changes: Jessica Rundhaug and Kali Bohn - Requested Release; Craig Nehring - Requested transfer to Immanuel Lutheran Church, New Auburn, MN

According to the provisions in income tax law, a minister of the Gospel is not subject to federal income tax on the allowance paid to him/her as part of his/her compensation to the extent used by him/her to provide a home. Therefore, based on estimates of their home expenses, Jim/Dallas moved that the following portions of the pastors' 2008 salaries be claimed as housing allotment: Pastor Beyer - \$7,000.00; Pastor Shank - \$4,500.00. The motion carried.

Joe/Clarice moved that a gift to the congregation from Francis and Kolleen Felber be used to establish an ELCA College Scholarship Fund. Details of the trust will be remanded to the Gifts and Memorials committee, who will work with the Felbers to outline parameters for the fund's use, and the rules for disbursement. The motion carried. A check was presented to the Council, who took that opportunity to thank the Felber family for their generosity.

Dallas/Terry moved that the Council authorize Congregational President Jason Erb to appoint a new member to the auditing committee. The motion carried.

The Gift from the Heart volunteers were recognized by the Council for their outstanding work in providing gifts to area families in need. It was noted that this important ministry made a difference in the lives of more than 400 children this year.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's prayer.

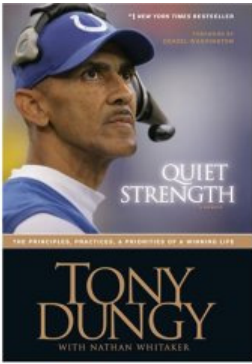

What does it take to be a modern day hero? Tony Dungy says "I really wanted to show people you can win all kinds of ways... For your faith to be more important than your job,

for your family to be more important than that job... we all know that's the way it should be... I'm not afraid to say it."

Denzel Washington wrote in the book's forward "Coach Dungy's life displays his steadfast belief in God and his submission to God's word. His story is a guide for basic living and a confession of his belief in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. This account is proof that Coach Dungy's beliefs have sustained him consistently throughout his life."

This book tells of coach Dungy's trials both personal and professionally and how he handled each one through his faith in God. It gives us a new picture and definition of "Coach". Lovie Smith says "Good guys do come in first".

Tony was Coach of the Year 2007. On February 4, 2007, he led the Colts to Super Bowl victory, the first such win for an African American coach.

Representatives from our Synod recently shared a valuable experience as they connected, listened and learned at the International Companion Synod/Companion Church Consultation for Latin America and the Caribbean.

The meeting, held November 15-18, 2007, in Costa Rica, focused on the theme of sustainability. Attending were Kay Erickson, Amery, representing the Global Mission Committee and Diane Kaufmann, Companion Synod Coordinator.

One very valuable exercise done with matching companion churches included talking about best practices to promote sustainability in our relationships. We shared things we should avoid or discontinue (*i.e., sending money without transparency or accountability, handing out money or gifts to individuals, not committing to the concept of accompaniment*) as well as activities we should either continue, maintain, or initiate (*i.e., supporting the national church, praying for each other, educating and training our synods about the companion synod relationship and about accompaniment, being more relational*). The conversation was frank, honest, and helpful.

We ended the plenary sessions by splitting into groups - ELCA staff, companion churches, and companion synods. Within each group we made requests of the other groups, made commitments, and listed action items. The process was beneficial and gave voice to each group. One of the commitments made by our group was "under the rubric of a spirituality of giftedness, we are open to and responsible for inviting and welcoming the gifts of our companions."

We are blessed by the gifts of our companions in Sinodo Centro Campanha Sul and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi. In 2008 we will continue our journey together, knowing that we have barely scratched the surface of the riches that await us in that journey.
