

A Message from the Pastor

The purpose of the church, according to the Great Commission, is to form disciples who form disciples. So here is my challenge to you: Worship Plus One. My challenge is for every member of FLC (all 1,200 of you) to choose to attend worship plus help with one thing every month. How is God calling you to grow as a disciple this year? To use the gifts God gave you to benefit God's mission, God's people, God's church? How would our church, even our town, be transformed if our members took the challenge on? What kind of impact would that have on our church? On our town? On you!?

But here is the most important information – the why?! Because God says so! Okay, a little bit more. Disciples are producers. And the only weapon that can stand against the burden of this life is something that cannot be removed, not even by death itself – God's love. We are called, by the waters of our baptism, to not keep it for ourselves but to share it with others. To be disciples of God. To be God's church.

Happy New Year! As we wind down from Christmas, some may be feeling a little tight around the waist from indulging in tasty foods and desserts. As we enter 2020, many will consider making lifestyle changes through a New Year's resolution. The word resolve, per Wikipedia, means to change an undesired trait or behavior; to accomplish a personal goal or otherwise improve his or her life. The most common resolutions include weight loss, exercise programs and smoking cessation. Per the American Medical Association, a resolution has its roots at the end of the Great Depression when approximately, 25% of American adults formed some type of New Year's resolution. Those that formed a resolution at that time, were 46% more likely to succeed than those who chose to make lifestyle changes at other times of the year.

The Facilities and Future Team was assembled in 2018 at the direction of Church Council to begin looking at the needs of our facility. What we have discovered is that the main focus areas of our congregation are the same as the survey results from five years ago.

- Improve main entrance
- Improvement to existing bathrooms/addition of new bathrooms
 - Creation of a youth space
 - Creation of greater fellowship space

Improved energy efficiency

Based on the focus of the church mission and for ease of future visioning, we have broken the focus areas into five categories. Described in the "Operational Space Impact" document, it was concluded that this is the foundation that First Lutheran needs to focus on to continue to carry out God's mission and continue to grow and thrive as a church of the future.

The committee will be visiting sites and meeting with church leadership for places that have undergone new build, remodels, and/or repurpose of space. We will having several more congregational conversations about each step along the way. We invite you to provide feedback and input to assist in developing the Master Plan.

Most Important Space

- Accessibility—Space for all individuals old, young, disabled, parenting, etc; Assess distance from car, bathrooms, elevation, family space, handicap accessible aisles
- Size appropriate for people present and the worship style
- · Chapel space for small groups
- Overflow for sanctuary
- Front space for groups such as music or youth programming
- Chancel space
- Air quality, temperature, humidity controlled environment.
- Live stream/Technology enhanced. Sound technology for the space

Functional Space for Administration

- Welcoming to visitors
- Staff offices
- Meeting room to fit Church Council and including library space with appropriate technology.

- I. The November 18, 2019 meeting of the First Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Andrew Harrington.
- II. Pastor Ron led the opening devotion.
- III. There was a call to amend and/or supplement the agenda for this November 18, 2019 meeting. Hence, a motion was made by Jason Erb to add an additional category of B. Internship Site to Pastor's Report on the Agenda. Jan Kienbaum seconded; motion carried.
- IV. A motion was made by Jan to accept the agenda with the above addition; Mike seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- V. The minutes from the Monday, October 21, 2019 meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Steve to approve the minutes as amended; this was seconded by Jan. Motion carried.
- VI. Treasurer's Report: A motion was made by Sue and seconded by Jason R. to accept the treasurer's report as given with additional discussion. Motion carried.

VII. Pastor's Report:

- a. Pastor Ron's pastoral duties were reported in terms of marriages, baptisms and funerals. There were two new members received this month, Kay and Rita Ploetz. Sue made the motion to accept the pastor's report; Mike seconded. Motion carried.
- b. FLC as an internship site. Discussion ensued regarding whether this were a possibility; there was a deadline given of 12/1/19 regarding this. The decision was made that a restricted internship site may be a possibility for academic year 2020/2021. A motion was made by Rod and seconded by Steve to approve same; motion carried.

VIII. New/Old Business:

- a. Bi-monthly Discussion regarding Mission/Visioning: Operational/Functional Spaces of the church. Following discussion regarding the mission of the church, it was determined that we would change same from "Welcoming all to build relevant faith" to "We love first because God first loved us". "First love, love first" has become the current functional language and more closely embodies the messages in our recent church services and activities. Ann made a motion that we adopt this language as the mission of First Lutheran Church; Jan seconded the motion. Motion carried. Secondly, we reviewed the conceptual piece which clearly shows the need for discussion regarding the functional space within the church to carry out ministry needs in the building itself. It was agreed that it should be sent to members at an estimated cost of up to \$200 for postage and meetings would follow church services regarding same. Further, a total of \$1000 was approved through Thrivent funds for travel and other associated costs for evaluation of this functional space issue. Jason E. made the motion to approve said dollars for postage and evaluative costs; Jan seconded. Motion carried.
- b. Property committee report: In particular, problems areas were discussed as it pertains to the moisture leaking through the bricks and mortar in the 1922 building, specifically affecting the sanctuary. This discussion supported the above motion for evaluation costs.
 - c. There was no formal report from the Personnel Committee.
- IX. With no other business, Mike made a motion to adjourn; Jan seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- X. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
