PASTOR RON'S MESSAGE

2023 is a year of celebration!



This fall, we will be celebrating two milestones in our faith. First, we will celebrate God's blessing that has been upon our congregation since 1884. Our congregation has a long history that reaches back to a mission station that was started in 1872 with Rev. C.J. Helsem. In 1884 this people of faith gathered as a church and called Rev. T.O. Juve as their pastor. The congregation was to be named First Norwegian Evangelical. They built

what would be their first building in 1890. A cyclone on June 12, 1899 lifted the newly completed edifice from its foundation and dashed it to the street. Only one timber remained. Church members began rebuilding at once. By 1906 (seven years after the first church was destroyed) the church steeple, bell, altar painting, and a furnace had been installed. The building was completed by 1920. On January 26, 1922 this small but brave congregation had to watch their church go up in flames. By June 22, 1922 they laid the cornerstone for their third church building. The new sanctuary was dedicated September 9th, 1923, and has since served as the central place for worship services for the past 100 years. We will be celebrating this centennial milestone of how God has called FLC to mission and ministry serving Barron and Beyond on Sunday September 10th.

Our second celebration comes from John Newton, sea captain, Anglican clergyman, and song writer who through the trials and hardships of life wrote "Amazing Grace" in 1773. This song continues to speak to our pain, our suffering, and the comfort we find in God's love for us. FLC has gone through many hardships, yet through it all God's amazing grace has given us the strength to carry out the ministry, comfort for our despair, and love to share as a community of faith. Written 250 years ago, the hymn Amazing Grace has a deep and long history of inspiring God's Church through adversity. Join us as we celebrate God's Amazing Grace this fall!

FROM THE BISHOP: STATEMENT ON ANTI-TRANSGENDER LEGISLATION



As we approach March 31, many people are preparing to recognize Transgender Day of Visibility, an international day to celebrate the contributions of transgender people and raise awareness about the deadly injustices they face.

As bishop of this church, I am concerned that the rights of transgender and nonbinary Americans have been targeted all over this nation. Nearly 400 anti-LGBTQIA+ bills were introduced across the United States in 2022, most of them targeting trans youth. That is twice the number from 2021 and almost eight times the total from 2020. The language in many of these bills attacks the humanity of trans and nonbinary people, often erasing the dignity that should be afforded to everyone.

While members of our church hold various convictions regarding gender, the teaching of our church supports legislation and policies to protect every person's human dignity and civil rights. (Human Sexuality, p. 19) As Christians we believe every human being is created in God's image, and we must honor and celebrate God's creation. Our church teaches that we affirm transgender and nonbinary siblings are God's children, who are loved unconditionally. Our social statement *Faith, Sexism, and Justice: A Call to Action* (2019) also declares that this church commits itself to "advocate for and support laws, policies, and practices that respect diverse bodies rather than discriminating against, objectifying, or devaluing them" (p. 60).

I urge us, as people of faith, to love our neighbors, care for the vulnerable and marginalized, and work for justice and equality. We may have differing opinions on "matters related to sexual orientation and gender identity," (FSJ, p. 61) but we must always uphold the dignity and humanity of everyone. These disagreements do not allow us to accept actions that dehumanize, discriminate against or objectify any individual or group.

We must stand together, dear church, faithfully advocating for the full humanity and dignity of all people. Let us recognize and affirm the humanity of our transgender and nonbinary siblings. Let us advocate for their dignity. Let us continue to be guided by God's love and compassion as we seek justice and equality for everyone.

Church funds will cover the cost of FLC kiddos AND their friends---who come WITH them to 2023 FLC Pizza and Pool Parties. Look for Lynn Kolpack when you arrive! Parents are invited to stay; bring a comfy lawn chair; enjoy pizza, munchies, and lemonade; watch their kids swim from the deck of the pool area---with no fee; and visit with Lynn while their kids have fun in the pool. If parents/guardians won't be able to stay for the party, Lynn will need to know parent/guardian names; cell numbers where they may be contacted, if needed, during the party; and the name/s of children being dropped off. At 7:00 p.m. or earlier, when parents are getting ready to take their children home, they are asked to check in with Lynn so she knows who is leaving. Our #1 goal is for kids to have fun on pool party days, but we want them to be safe. Please help Lynn keep your children safe. Thank you!

Party fun will begin with pizza, munchies, lemonade, chips, and sweet treats---at no cost---enjoyed from 4:30 – 5:00 p.m. at picnic tables near the bathhouse. After eating, the fun moves into the pool! FLC kids and their friends need to tell the lifeguard who's on duty at the front desk, "I'm here with the First Lutheran Pool Party," when they sign-up so their pool admissions will be paid for them. Kids with season swim passes DO NOT need to sign-up on the FLC Pool Party Sheet; they simply sign in with their pass numbers.

If parents plan to be in the water with their children and they don't have SEASON POOL PASSES, they will need to pay their own pool admissions of \$7.00. There is no admission fee for children who are one year old or younger. Parents must stay with/supervise littles/toddlers/preschoolers who join us for parties. Water wings/life jackets are welcome, if needed. If you have questions, contact Lynn.


Explanation for the above chart:


