

If anyone has any questions or would like to step into a role on our committee, we encourage you to reach out to any of us listed below.








BSA News

New Facilities update!

The Facilities and Future Committee has been hard at work this past quarter and we are excited to say that we have plans for our new build! The Master Plan gives us a clear description of what the space will look like in terms of how big the rooms will be and where they will be located. It does not outline the specifics of materials used. For example, we know we have a kitchen, where it is located in the building, and how big the walls will be. What we do not know is what the cabinets are going to be made out of, the color of the floor etc.



Property:

Having a Master Plain is a huge step in our planning process. The next step is for the F&F Committee and Council to meet with a capital campaign consultant and have a vitality study done. The vitality study will help give us an idea of how to move forward with the new build. In preparation for the study, the Church Council will spend time cleaning the membership rolls of the church. This is a task that has not been done in over a decade. No time like the present to dust off those record books! We are excited to be entering into this next phase of our build and to see where and how God is calling us to Love Others First.



Dear friend,

Recently, several disasters made the news. Here are some of the biggest ones:

- In Puerto Rico and the Caribbean, Hurricane Fiona brought torrential rainfall and devastating flooding to the islands. Almost exactly five years after Hurricane Maria, Puerto Rico is again experiencing an island-wide blackout and damaged buildings and infrastructure. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with the Caribbean Synod to develop an immediate response in impacted communities.
- In Alaska, the remnants of Typhoon Merbok have caused widespread flooding along the state's western coast. This was one of the worst storms in recent decades in Alaska, with strong waves and heavy rainfall damaging homes, seawalls, roads and other infrastructure. Officials are planning a quick relief period before the water freezes. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with the Alaska Synod to address the needs of those impacted by the storm.
- In Japan, Typhoon Nanmadol hit Kyushu, the country's southernmost main island. At least two people were killed and dozens more injured in the storm, which moved northward over Honshu. Wind gusts of over 145 mph and heavy rainfall caused at least one landslide and damaged homes and businesses. We have been in touch with the ELCA's global personnel in Japan.
- In Papua New Guinea, a 7.7 magnitude earthquake hit on Sep. 11, with ensuing aftershocks. At least three people died, and many buildings and roads were impacted. There is a strong Lutheran presence in the impacted area, including a Lutheran nursing school connected to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea (ELCPNG) that was damaged in the earthquake. We have been in contact with the ELCPNG to discuss a possible response.

ELCA News (Cont.)

- **In Pakistan**, the summer monsoon flooding is causing a widespread humanitarian crisis. The flooding has killed 1,500 people and up to 7 million people may be displaced. Lutheran Disaster Response is contributing to an ACT Alliance appeal that addresses the needs of flooded communities. Through the appeal, local partners will provide food, temporary shelter and bedding, rebuilding materials and psychosocial support.
- In Florida, Hurricane Ian made landfall with near Category 5-strength winds, dumping record amounts of rain and causing catastrophic flooding. Hurricane Ian bore down through Florida and is expected to make landfall again in the Carolinas. Early reports indicate the potential for a substantial loss of life. Ian, as predicted, is one of the worst hurricanes to hit the United States in decades.

These are just the disasters that made the biggest headlines. There are countless smaller disasters that don't make the news. With your gifts to the <u>Lutheran Disaster Response general fund</u>, we can respond to as many as possible – whenever and wherever they strike.

Again and again, you show up for our neighbors impacted by disasters in the United States and around the world. Thank you. Please join me in prayer and partnership to support all those impacted.




Explanation for the above chart:

Because staff enable programming to happen by equipping volunteers, here is a pie chart of our total ministry expenses to help us understand the true cost of what it takes for our ministries to happen. For simplicity in calculations, Pastor Ron's salary is distributed evenly over all the ministry areas. Some expenses are paid in lump sums but allocated quarterly for reporting purposes.


