FROM THE PASTOR

2 Corinthians 4:16 – So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day.

Dear Church,

These are certainly crazy times we are living in! We are entering into our sixth month of pandemic disruption. A COVIDcation for many who are finding the time and a needed distraction to punch a few house projects off the list. For others, this has been a devastating disturbance to life as they struggle with loss of income due to joblessness and quarantine shutdowns resulting in homelessness and food insecurity; anxiety has been heightened with leaders and parents making hard decisions that may impact the health and wellbeing of self and family; and illness and death caused by the COVID virus. There is certainly much reason to lose heart.

Here in the Midwest we sit-by watching our outer nature waste away as fires consume homes to the West and winds and water destroy communities to our East. The political fighting happening in our Nation as well as our community. The issue of health and safety that has resulted in neighbors attacking neighbors over if a person should wear a face mask or not. The brutality by police officers who took an oath to serve and protect those in need that has resulted in needless harm and senseless killing. The looting, rioting, burning of buildings and businesses as both an act of anger and destruction. The racial justice issues and systemic corruption of America. There is much reason to lose heart.

Yet, even still, we see our Barron community being renewed more and more with every day we draw breath. We have seen neighbors meeting neighbors for the first time. Bears sitting in house windows as signs of support for our school aged children. Chalk drawings thanking those who are serving the sick and the dying. Cards and signs to encourage those in resident homes who have been confined to their rooms to protect their health. Peaceful and impactful protests against racial injustices. These and so many more ways Barron has come closer together demonstrating how we are "Small Town Strong."

Together here at First Lutheran Church we have drawn on the deep wisdom of our faith for strength and courage. Through these past six months we have bore witness to experiencing anakainoo in life, practice, and faith. Anakainoo, translated "renewed" in 2 Corinthians 4:16, refers to how we are currently experiencing being changed into a new kind of life by a force outside of our selves. Here, we see the Holy Spirit influencing our lives, and shaping our hearts. Through these times we are continually being renewed, being changed, little by little. With every decision we choose and every action we make the Spirit is bring about a renewal of our soul. As we look around and see so many examples of how our world, our lives, are wasting away; even if our own personal life and health is being threatened, our inner nature is being renewed.

As a congregation we are experiencing the fruition in part of that renewal. We experienced the first time our congregation has come together with 20 volunteers calling every member of our church to simply ask "how you doing?" and "what do you need?". We learned about the depth of our Compassion as Christians with a congregational initiative "Compassion Camp." This was so successful we are going to attempt to repeat a similar offering as we will spend intentional time learning about the Beatitudes. Our congregation has been shaped little by little with the expansion of our online worship service and Bible Studies that continue to reach more people today than we did before the pandemic began. Much of what we had done 7 months ago is different today. Some of which are just temporary aides to get us

through to the other side, while other parts we will keep for the long-term. While no one knows what will happen in the future, we can rest assured that our future is held secure in our God who made us and daily works in us to renew us and give us the strength we need to face today's challenges. May the assured strength of our Father in Heaven, the compassion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and the providence of the Holy Spirit renew you day by day.






STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

These have been interesting and challenging times for us all. While our challenges are as varied as our contexts, through it all the steadfastness of our Lord remains. In response to all that our Lord has done, we respond in boldness and generosity. *THANK YOU for your financial support to make the mission of FLC possible to Love Others First Because God First Loved Us.* Your involvement in the variety of ministries of our congregation and gracious donations for collection initiatives like our summer CASA Closet items, the LWR School Kits happening right now, and everything else in-between has been amazing. We especially want to highlight and thank the generosity of several donors who each pledged over \$5,000 during this difficult time so we could purchase equipment to improve the quality of our Livestreaming ministry. With stay-at-home orders and discouraged gathering statements issued these past couple months, our digital ministries have become even more important. Thank you for responding to God's grace in your lives in the various ways you have been called to do so!

What we are doing is making a difference in our town and larger community and is made possible because you are a part of it! Thanks to your financial support of our Mission Plan along with our qualified Paycheck Protect Program, we are weathering the pandemic well. However, at present we are roughly \$13,000 behind in our budget. To ensure our current ministry capacity continues and in order to consider future needs, we would like to offer a \$5 a week challenge to our members. Could you consider increasing your giving to FLC by just \$5 a week? If every household accepted this challenge, we would raise \$13,000 by the end of the year. A \$5 a week donation would mean over \$52,000 increase to our Ministry Plan next year. Consider the needs that we have right now that are going unmet in our church, in Barron, and our County and how FLC can meet those needs with this increase!


CASA advocates are often the only consistent, reliable adult in the life of a child whose world has been turned upside down due to abuse and/or neglect.

MEMBER CARE

It has now been over six months of living during a pandemic. We have been feeling the strain of our lives being altered in all aspects. Working from home or in person, classroom versus virtual learning, grocery shopping, child care as well as attending to our elderly loved ones all create unique challenges for individuals and families. Practicing social distancing creates feelings of isolation, anxiety as well as uncertainty. Some may feel angry at the loss of our freedom. We are being asked to sacrifice for the greater good. The recommendations by health experts are meant to slow the virus surge while awaiting a vaccine.

We must pause, take a deep breath and remember, we are not alone. Being open to new ideas, resources as well as reaching out to others may help to see us through this time in our lives.



There are several on-line resources that may prove helpful in navigating life during this challenging time. Some approaches to consider:

Life Strategies

- Maintain a routine for the children and adults in your family. Make a daily schedule for eating, study time as well as exercise. Include activities for your mind as well as your body that are fun.
- Limit news consumption and seek reliable resources.
- Find activities other than television such as reading a book or finding a new recipe.
- Get out a board game, work a puzzle or do some Spring cleaning of a closet or storage area.

Health Strategies

- Maintain healthy eating habits, exercise and eat healthy foods from all the food groups.
- Avoid alcohol and tobacco. This may be a challenging time to quit smoking or the perfect time.
- Walk your dog, participate in on-line exercise class or yoga class.
- Play music or dance. Great for the body, mind and spirit!

Spiritual Strategies

- Be realistic about your concerns. Focus on what you can do and accept what you cannot do.
- Write a letter to yourself and discuss your experiences and thoughts. This is a historical time and future family members will gain knowledge regarding how life was for you.
- Make a list of relatives or friends and call or Face-Time them on a routine basis. Sharing feelings may help you understand you are not alone.
- Call or email an old friend. Check on a neighbor who may feel isolated.
- Seek spiritual guidance. First Lutheran has been blessed to have Live-Streaming, radio broadcast as well as Facebook Page in which to remain connected, spiritually. First Friends is a helpful group of volunteers reaching out to each member to check in and make themselves available if needed. Feel free to be a part of this group or other volunteer groups at FLC.


Flu Season



We are able to provide the ministries we have at FLC in large part thanks to the efforts of our amazing staff team. Because staff enable programing to happen by equipping volunteers, here is a pie chart of our total ministry expenses to help us understand the true cost of what it takes for our ministries to happen. For simplicity in calculations, Pastor Ron's salary is distributed evenly over all the ministry areas. Some expenses are paid in lump sums but allocated quarterly for reporting purposes.

These days we aren't gathering in the building like we use to. GivePlus is an easy way to consistently give financially to support FLC's mission using their autopay feature. You can enroll using either a credit card or bank account. Once you sign-up, you can check your giving records as well. 
