PASTOR RON'S MESSAGE

Welcome to 2023! A New Year, a New You, but the Same Jesus.

As we continue to live out of the impacts of the Covid Pandemic we must first ask how we, as First Lutheran Church, plan to change and grow into the new year. Weird, I know, but as we start this new year, we need to first consider how we want to change and then make a plan for it.

Some changes happen without our desires, some changes happen if we want them to or not. Covid pandemic and its effects on the way we live is a good example of this. Another is to note that we are living into a new year no matter how much we may want to deny it. So what will this new year bring? How is it going to shape you with new experiences?

If you continue to do the same things you did last year, you are going to continue to get the same results. If you truly want a new you this new year what is going to change to make that happen? These are the questions we have been asking the past several months here at FLC. We started our reflection with Council and that led to conversation and surveys with congregation. Our latest survey was looking at identifying and naming our core values. Here are the results from that survey.

Keeping in mind that all the other values listed are important to who we are, but this list are the ones the majority felt were the most important. According to the poll we took of our congregation, our top five Core Values are:

- 1) Caring for one another
- 2) Worship
- 3) Children
- 4) Scripture
- 5) Prayer

To help us be intentional in developing a mission plan for the new year, we are taking these Core Values and reflecting on them at the committee levels to help us identify ways we need to shape our ministries to better align our values and mission. For example: how do we [Love Others First] by [Caring for one another]? How do we [Love Others First] by [worship].

As you can see values are in themselves not actionable. We need a plan to do that. So here is the plan. In the coming months every committee is going to identify and reflect on the ministries they do. Do they line up with our top Core Values? In this process each committee is then going to

create short-term, mid-term, and long-term goals to help guide how we are developing our ministries toward desired outcomes.

We are church together, gathered together around our common mission to Love Others First. How are we going to live out this mission in 2023? *Together*.

Church is a community where we gather together to encourage one another and support one another. Jesus is the same this year as last year. The Gospel promise has not changed. God's love for you is immutable. But how we experience God's love and how we serve the Kingdom is changing.

What will the new year bring?

Change. For that is certain. Some of the changes we have no control over. Others are going to happen to us if we want them to or not, but we have the opportunity to influence how we are going to be changed. But, through it all one thing is certain. We will experience it and navigate the coming changes of 2023 together.



We served a total of 214 children from 78 families with gifts of clothes and toys and/or coats and snow pants, boots and hats and mittens this last year.

The families that received gifts for their children for Christmas also received a food box filled with everything needed for a Christmas dinner. This was organized by Marge Colby and her team. Also included in the boxes were coupons for milk and eggs from Kwik Trip. Each of these families received a bag of household goods that included toothbrushes, toothpaste, a bar of soap, shampoo, and dish soap. These families also received a bag of new/gently used books appropriate for their children. These books were organized by the volunteers from the Methodist Church. The Cupboard and Closet donated many of the books that were given! This year the National Honor Society at the high school had a book drive to help fill these bags! That was a truly wonderful gift!

We organized our annual packing and distribution days like we had done the last couple of years. We had fewer volunteers helping on each of those days and had the families remain in their vehicles while we checked IDs and loaded their cars! It all went very smoothly thanks to the many volunteers from St. Joe's Catholic Church, Methodist Church, Four Square Gospel Church, Salem Lutheran Church and our own First Lutheran Church!

Our committee had many conversations via email and in person to organize the year's program! Everything from printing posters and putting them together, hanging up the posters, putting the ads in the paper, printing labels and mailing out letters to organizations and businesses, organizing the lists of families and children, keeping track of the finances, organizing the bags of books, organizing and packing the gifts from First Lutheran, putting together the food boxes, calling the families, filling the coat and snow pants requests, setting up for packing and distribution days, sending out Thank Yous, to the culmination of loading the family's cars full of such wonderful gifts from the Barron Area communities, was accomplished by these amazing volunteers with smiles on their faces!

All this to give the children and families in the Barron Area School District not just a happier Christmas or warm winter clothing, but to give them hope for tomorrow, joy for today and most of all the knowledge that someone cares!

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Community Outreach Committee Annual Report 2022

Last February confirmation students helped with fleece blankets for our Community Outreach program. We were able to complete 11 fleece blankets that afternoon with several more blankets finished at a later date.

We had a Fleece Drive in May to make more blankets for the newcomers to our area. With the money and fleece that was donated, on Sunday, June 26th we held an after church "Fleece Tying Extravaganza"! We had a wonderful turnout of people! There were treats and coffee for everyone and we had people of all ages cutting fleece, tying fleece and making tags for the blankets. It was a great time of fellowship and doing God's work! We were able to finish about 25 more blankets! At this point we still have money in our Fleece Fund and will plan another Fleece Blanket Tying day this winter.

When we deliver the blankets to the families, we include a coupon donated from the Cupboard and Closet that can be used to purchase clothing. Also included is information about our church services and K-WOW program! If there are children, we also include games or toys and if needed, coats are included as well. All of this is packed in a large reusable tote bag that the families can keep. There have been at least 5 families, one couple and one single person that have benefited from this program.

As a committee we have discussed how to continue to fund this program. We reached out to Kiwanis and they agreed to help us for the 2023 year with a donation of \$500. It has been put into a separate fund titled "Kiwanis New Barron Families". It is a restricted fund and can be used only for welcoming new families to the communities of the Barron Area School District. The money can be used to purchase items such as: blankets, coats and other winter clothing, toys and games. This fund is not to be used for people/families who come with the intention of moving to another school district. A report has been made to the Kiwanis at their first meeting in January detailing the program. At this point we are still in need of a source of funding for families/people new to the U.S. and Wisconsin who will not be living in the Barron School District.

The Outreach Committee had a vehicle at the city's Trunk or Treat day. We were in the Woodland Elementary School parking lot and were visited by about 200 children! First Lutheran gave out a treat bag filled with candy and information about our church services and the K-WOW program! It was a beautiful day and a great time!

We hope to have another worship service and potluck meal for the Filipino families in the area. We will be contacting Pastor Rom from the cities to help with the service. We look forward to welcoming them into our church again and worshipping with them and sharing a meal.

Bible People

We are a Biblical people. Because we are also Lutheran, we would say something fancy like *Sola Scriptura*, which means "scripture alone" – one of the five "solas" we hold (faith, grace, Christ, and to God's Glory are the other four in case you were curious). What does it mean to say we are Biblical people? It means we see scripture as a living testament of faith. We see the people, the events, and God's work happening in scripture. We also see their story as our story. We see how God was at work thousands of years ago and how God continues to be at work today through us.



This Lenten season, at our midweek Holden Evening Prayer worship services, we will encounter a Biblical figure and hear their faith story in monologue style about their encounter with Jesus and how their lives were changed because of it. Because their story is our story, there will be aspects that are very similar to our lives and our encounters with God. Hearing their stories told from a first person perspective, you will be inspired to see God in a new way at work in your own life. CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP

"From Worry to Wonder"

On June 19, 2020 our granddaughter was born. She was born three months into the pandemic. Her parents were worried. Her grandparents were worried. It is challenging enough to be pregnant and give birth in the best of times but to give birth in the middle of a worldwide pandemic is an even greater worry. We worried about the unknown dangers this virus might present to the mother, the unborn baby, and the new born baby. Our worries kept us up at night. Our worries were relieved when she was finally born, perfect in every way. Our worry gave way to wonder-filled joy. Worry transformed to wonder as we looked back to see how God was holding and carrying them through the unavoidable worry. Our worry transformed to gratitude and wonder watching for what God would be up to next in her tiny life.

It's December 2022. We prepare to celebrate the birth our Lord Jesus. This Advent we come with our fears and worries too. We are living in the midst of challenging times in our country. The very foundation of our nation seems less stable. We each come with our own personal set of worries and fears about our families, health, finances, work, safety, the future...What is it that keeps you up at night? What are you worried about today?

Folks across our church are experiencing doubts and uneasiness about the future of their church. Does it keep you up at night? What are the threats to your church's future? How can the conversation move from fear and worry to wonder? As the miracle of Christ's birth is celebrated this season, we can move from worry to wonder. We wonder what God is up to now in this day and age. Together we wonder what God's will is for the future of our church. Together we wonder; how can we use the abundance and blessings, (what we do have and opportunities in front of us), to make a difference in Jesus' name.

Now in that same region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. Luke 2:8-10a

Shepherds living in the fields watched over their sheep to keep them safe. There were dangers that kept the shepherds up at night and plenty of things for the shepherd's to worry about in the cold night like wild animals, predators, thieves, & bad weather. There was so much to worry about, but one night an angel of the Lord, all shiny and bright appeared and transformed their fears and worldly worry to divine wonder.

To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" Luke 2:11-14

Friends, you are precious, beloved, baptized children of God. We know that the antidote to worry is to trust in God.

During this Advent, Christmas and Epiphany season I pray that your worries will be transformed to wonder at what God **is** doing and promises **to** do in your lives and in our churches. May the miracle of Christ's birth transform your worries to wonder! I am grateful for your partnership in ministry.




- Column 1 is the actual quarter 4 donations and expenses.


