### **Property Committee News**

Happy New Year from the Property Committee! With a vision of a new church in the process with the Facilities and Future Committee, First Lutheran continues to have issues with our current building. Below is a recap of what we have repaired in 2023 and a few of the larger projects we plan on addressing in 2024.

#### 2023 projects completed:

- 1. Replace roof over the Education wing.
- 2. Landscaping on the southeast corner of the church and built an area for the garbage dumpster.
- 3. Repair the exhaust fan in the kitchen.

#### 2024 projects:

1. Repair the upper walls in the sanctuary where there has been moisture damage.

2. Replace the south entrance steps and three slabs of concrete in front of the stairs. Pastor Ron has made temporary steps to get by until we are able to get the concrete company to come in the spring. (With our chicken dinner fundraising and member's donations, money has been raised to cover the cost of this project.)

- 3. Repair the ramp near the coffee bar. The ramp has dropped slightly that it has created a safety issue.
- 4. Repair/Replace the urinal in the men's restroom near the coffee bar.

The Property Committee meets the 2nd Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. Please join us as more hands will help maintain our current church.

#### **Community Outreach**

#### What is a Tiny Home of Barron County?

Tiny Homes are built for unsheltered individuals or families who are in need of temporary housing. They provide a safe place to live while the individual/family gain financial stability, make connections to resources and look for permanent housing. These Tiny Homes are equipped with a sleeping area, a chemical toilet, and kitchenette that includes a microwave and mini refrigerator.

As a church, we would provide the space and electricity for the Tiny Home and provide support to the individual/family living there by inviting them to worship, to our Wednesday community meals and by periodically checking in with them!

The Barron County Tiny Homes are not for anyone that is found to be homeless right off the street, but for those that have been vetted by the county and that are gainfully employed already. These people have worked hard to qualify for this type of housing!

The Tiny Home committee will plan to hold listening sessions beginning sometime in January in preparation for the installation of the Tiny Home in March!



#### "A SIMPLE ACT OF LOVE CAN SAVE A VILLAGE"

Once again, I give thanks for the generous support that First Lutheran Church-Barron has extended to the dire needs in Malawi, Africa. Throughout the Lenten Season and the year, FLC lifted our sisters and brothers in prayer, generous financial support, and love.

This year, Malawi suffered the most catastrophic consequences from Cyclone Freddy. Strong winds, mudslides, landslides, and flash floods hit 15 districts . Leading to death, displacement, and destruction. Crops being lost, wells being contaminated along with rivers and Lake Malawi. The worst outbreak of Cholera since 2003 which was prior to vaccines. Centre for Girls and Women Empowerment turned their attention to life saving strategies.

With the huge financial support given to CFGWE from FLC they had the capability to supply clinics and hospitals with: M200 bottles of IV fluids, 150 cannulas tubes, 3,500 examination gloves, 360 packets of aqua tables for drinking water, 50 kilograms of chlorine powder, along with sets and sets of safe water stations. The fight against Cholera was urgent because Cholera kills within hours when left untreed. I cannot express the gratitude shown in your prayers, financial support, and love to assist Malawians to survive and recover the best they could from such a catastrophe. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

November was the beginning of the planting season. The foundation turned their attention to education on healthy gardening practices. The importance of growing a variety of produce to nurture children to prevent stunted growth and mental retardation. Permaculture gardens are of the utmost importance. Strides are being made to develop them.

Classes on business management for individuals and groups are also being offered. Those who have been working toward a goal in business or education for a better way of life can receive assistance. Our basic belief is when a person invests in themself and strides to achieve through their own initiative they will succeed. This in turn gives them the ability to pass it forward.

CFGWE is looking forward to 2024 being a year filled with many achievements. Your blessings are immeasurable!




Explanation for the above chart:
